

DO YOU KNOW YOUR RISK?



People who use drugs, especially if they inject drugs, are at high risk for HIV, hepatitis B, and hepatitis C.

Sharing syringes
or injection equipment is the 2nd most common way to become infected with HIV.

Injection drug use is the **MOST COMMON** risk factor for acute hepatitis B.

Up to 40% of new hepatitis C cases are in people who inject drugs.

 **IT'S TIME TO GET TESTED!**

Getting tested is an important step you can take today!

It's Easy.

Talk to staff at this location for help getting tested. They can also help you get treatment if you need it and help you **stay HIV and hepatitis free.**



What if I have a negative test?

Great! There are some other things you can do to **prevent infection**, such as getting a hepatitis B vaccine or **taking medication to prevent HIV**.



What if I have a positive test?

It's ok! There is a very high cure rate for hepatitis C. There are long-term medications you can take for both HIV and hepatitis B. **You can still live a long, healthy life.**
