Prescribing Daily Oral PrEP


Pill Supply

- 1 fixed-dose combination tablet
- 90-day supply TDF/FTC OR TAF/FTC
- Optional: some clinicians prefer to give a 30-day supply at initiation to enable them to check on the patient sooner

Return for Follow-Up

Schedule follow-up visit for 30 or 90 days (depending on number of pills supplied)

On-Demand Dosing (2:1:1), for MSM
